1. BACKGROUND

The Harry Gwala Development Agency (HGDA) is responsible for maintaining the cleanliness, safety, and functionality of its operational sites. As part of its facilities management responsibilities, the Agency seeks to enhance the overall condition of its premises through routine grounds maintenance. This includes grass cutting and the application of herbicide (poisoning) along the exterior boundary fence. Additionally, HGDA has identified the need to address unauthorized connections that may pose safety risks or affect operational integrity at its sites.

2. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this project is to appoint a service provider to undertake grass cutting, poisoning along the exterior boundary fence, and the removal of illegal connections within HGDA-managed sites. The objective is to ensure that grass is kept at a manageable length, fence lines are clear of overgrowth, and any unauthorized electrical connections are identified and removed. This intervention is aimed at promoting safety, reducing fire hazards, preventing pest infestation, enhancing site appearance, and supporting compliance with municipal bylaws and health and safety regulations.

3. SCOPE OF WORK

The appointed service provider will be responsible for cutting grass in all designated areas to maintain a neat and uniform appearance. Applying herbicide along the exterior boundary fence to prevent grass and weed regrowth. Identifying and safely removing illegal water or electrical connections along the fence. Cleaning up and disposing of all grass cuttings and debris after each service.

The appointed service provider is required to complete the grass cutting, poisoning along the exterior boundary fence, and removal of illegal connections within 7 days from the date of order. Timely completion is essential to meet the agency's operational and safety standards.

- 1.5 Failure on the part of a tenderer to submit proof or documentation required in terms of this tender to claim points for specific goals with the tender, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for specific goals are not claimed.
- 1.6 The organ of state reserves the right to require of a tenderer, either before a tender is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the organ of state.

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Municipal Bidding Document (MBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.

Joint venture or Consortium means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract.

10. I am aware that, in addition and without prejudice to any other remedy provided to combat any restrictive practices related to bids and contracts, bids that are suspicious will be reported to the Competition Commission for investigation and possible imposition of administrative penalties in terms of section 59 of the Competition Act No 89 of 1998 and or may be reported to the National Prosecuting Authority (NPA) for criminal investigation and or may be restricted from conducting business with the public sector for a period not exceeding ten (10) years in terms of the Prevention and Combating of Corrupt Activities Act No 12 of 2004 or any other applicable legislation.
